



Did you know there is valuable information on both the National and State websites? Not only can you register for the different upcoming events; you can also educate yourself on a lot of topics. Knowledge is power and with no knowledge you are in the dark and unprepared for the many new Postal related items that come at us every day and what retirement may look for you in the future. The time is now to prepare before you realize the setbacks you may face because you didn't know, didn't recognize or really just didn't take the time to learn.

# **NATIONAL Website: UNITEDPMA.ORG**

1. Header "Resources" then "Forms and Reference Materials" you can reference the new 2024 salary scale, 2024 pay band schedule and latest 2021 Pay Talk decision. The next set of talks aren't scheduled until after the NALC ratifies their contract. With that being said, we aren't waiting for that to take place. The National office is always trying to better our positions with pay and benefits. Take for example: Last year the 3% raise was negotiated to be put in place prior to the end of the fiscal year. This allowed for the NPA to be added in after your salary was already increased. The same scenario was also used for raising the top of the pay bands prior to the NPA pay outs both for last year and this year, which gave anyone at the top the chance to raise their salary even more. The NPA cell percentages were agreed to be changed as well, prior to the NPA payout where mostly each cell number 3,4,5, etc are actually the percentage you get as long as it doesn't exceed the top of the pay band. If it does, the rest comes in a merit lump sum. Just imagine how much you may have lost if this wasn't agreed to prior to the NPA

cell % increases. The top of the pay bands increased 8.8% in the last two years. Even if you were not at the top of the pay band and you scored a cell 4 each year you would have raised your salary considerably. Last year 3% raise, cell 4 was 2.5%, cell 4 this year 4% which equaled a 9.5% minimum increase in two years. Inflation is hurting everyone which is why strategically your pay has increased. This gets compounded in your salary every year you work toward retirement. I say thank you Mr. UPMA President, Edmund Carley.

- 2. Header "Events" then "On line training schedule" you can reference videos of valuable information like IMIP's, CSV/SOV, NPA Mitigation process, most recent contracts for the APWU and NRLCA and The Legal Defense video.
- 3. Header "Membership" then "Adverse Action Legal Defense Plan" you can reference what exactly we do to protect and maintain your job when you come under a disciplinary action. Please read this and then spread the word on why we have the best system to defend you. You will find it is superior to no others.

# NY CHAPTER Website: NYUNITEDPMA.ORG

1. Header "Legislative" tells you about current news on the legislative front and what PAC (Political Action Committee) is, why we need it and how to donate. This is why we maintain a presence each year pushing not only our agenda but the Postal Service as well. Why you ask? Read above where I explained the raises etc. If we weren't on the Hill pushing for Postal Reform, none of that would have happened. We would be back to either no raises or the 1.2% or so each year.


As a retiree, I still attend the business meetings,

# How to Construct the Perfect KSA's and Land the Interview

If you are anything like me, overthinking is second nature. While putting these together be good to yourself. Whenever I'm heading down that rabbit hole, that's a phrase my husband uses as a signal that I'm doing it again, I need to stop and start again.

In all seriousness, writing the perfect KSA is very simple; do not overcomplicate it.

Stick to the cold, hard facts.

Use the S.T.A.R method.

For each KSA question, you must convey a direct parallel between your experiences and the KSA question you are addressing. Simply talk about your experiences and how they relate to the knowledge, skill, or ability (KSA) questions. If you are not like me, then, this will be that much easier and for sure you're landing the interview straightaway. Let's go.

What is the STAR method you ask? This method will provide guidance and keep you on track when composing your KSA's. For each question, you want to clearly explain the **situation** creating a foundation which you'll build on. You then want to explain the **task** at hand due to the situation. Followed by literal **actions** taken verbatim – do not deviate. You must also provide in detail the overall **results** which will tie it together nicely. Hence the STAR or Situation, Task, Action(s), and Results – method.

Once you're done with all of the above, then and only then, are you allowed to soften the edges if you feel it's necessary but it is certainly not required. Be sure to have your good writer friend look them over and give feedback, for spell check, grammar check, content – the whole works.

I hope this information will be helpful. Until next time, take care and be well.


# NY Chapter Bylaw Amendment Submission Requirements

# **Article XIX - Amendments**

All proposed amendment(s) must be submitted in writing to the Chapter president at least sixty (60) days prior to the opening of the annual Chapter convention. The proposed amendment(s) shall be published in one or more ways using the State publication and or Website at a minimum prior to the convention. These bylaws may be amended at any convention of the chapter by a 2/3 vote of the delegates present and voting or if the State Convention is cancelled by 2/3 vote of the electronic returns, mail in vote returned or combination thereof. The Executive Board will decide the proposed method. Any proposed amendment(s) shall be read at one session of the convention or electronic meeting and voted on at a subsequent session with the opportunity to mail in their vote or electronically submit as the Executive Board had decided on the method. A deadline date would be imposed at that time depending on the current concerns of not having a convention. These amendment(s) shall become effective immediately upon the adjournment of the convention unless otherwise specified in the amendment.

It is suggested that each submission submitted should show the current bylaw with strikethrough for anything proposed to eliminate and in bold anything wishing to add. Then rewrite showing exactly how if

approved it would read.

Any member may submit changes. They must be submittied to Mary Dillon or Dan Leonard at least 60 days before the opening of State Convention.

Submissions must be received by April 6, 2024.

Please make sure you show the current bylaw with strikethrough for words to be eliminated and use bold font for the proposed additions. Please rewrite the entire section where changes are to be made showing exactly how it would read, if approved.

Bylaw changes will be voted on at State Convention.





# THE DOWNSTATE PERSPECTIVE

We are getting ready to visit Capitol Hill. We have made our appointments with our Senators and our representatives in the House. I know that not everyone is available to make the trip to Washington D.C. You can still do your part to carry our message to our Senators and representatives right from home.

The issues and talking points will soon be posted on UPMA'S National website. The website address is, www.unitedpma.org; You will have to log in. Don't have an account for United Postmasters and Managers of America (UPMA) website? Create one in just a few simple steps. After you are logged in just click on the UPMA logo. Then click the three black lines on the upper right to bring up the menu. When the menu comes up, click on Government Relations. The first thing you will see is United Postmasters and Managers of America Legislative Issues. Click on 2024 Legislative Issues Brief. You can read them or copy them. (Bring a copy with you when you meet with your representative). Now you are ready to schedule a meeting. Just go to www.house.gov; and www.senate.gov. Find your representative, Senators and request a meeting at the representative's their local office. The local office address will be on the

representative's website.

If you are not able to travel to your representative's local office you can still help our issues to heard. You can from the representative's website email them with our issues. I urge you to take the time to get our issues, that effect both active and retired Postal employees to your representatives. For many retirees, the Social Security Fairness Act H R 82 is very important. It has 306 cosponsors. The Social Security Fairness Act S 597 has fifty cosponsors. These bills would repeal the WEP/GPO from 1983. The two bills should be coming up for a vote very soon. Please do your part to help these bills pass.

All our New York State representatives are signed on as cosponsors, except Claudia Tenney. So, you can thank your representative for their support. Please reach out to Congresswoman Claudia Tenney and ask her to support the Social Security Fairness Act. Congresswoman Tenney was a cosponsor of the bill in 2021-2022. Congresswoman Tenney is a member of the House Committee on Ways and Means. It is important to get this bill out of committee and to the floor for a vote. Be well be safe. God bless.
